Dear Parent/Carer

We are coming to the end of yet another half term in lockdown, and we are all aware how tough this has been for students, parents and staff. Managing distance learning and teaching is something we are all coming to terms with but I don't underestimate how difficult this can be, especially for students in Year 11 coming up to GCSEs in the summer.

We all need to be kind to ourselves; while school work is important, and our expectations of students are high, we must all be realistic as well about managing workload for everyone and keeping everything in perspective. Mental health and wellbeing is our priority and we must balance this against keeping teaching and learning going.

Thank you for your patience and understanding through these difficult times. Like everyone, I am looking forward to a return to 'normality', or something like it, as soon as possible - so please play your part everyone and do the right thing, stay home, stay safe for a little while longer.
